Education

A small, unspoiled island of rural "old world" charm and prisitine deserted beaches. Paso Fino horses roam free throughout the island. The Bioluminescent Bay is the brightest natural phenomenon in the world. No commecrical developments and not one traffic light. La Isla Nena, the baby sister of Puerto Rico, habitats 9,000 Viequenses and is only 3.5 miles wide by 21 miles long. Vieques is a tropical paradise, an experience you will never forget.

Hope Builders has rebuilt over 190 homes since Hurricane Maria hit in 2017. With your help we plan to build 100 more within the year.

There are two ways to arrive to the island of Vieques, by ferry or plane. The schedule for the ferry can be found on PorFerry.com A one way passenger ticket is \$2 from the port in Ceiba, Puerto Rico; roughly 45 minutes by car from San Juan. At the dock, long term parking options are available.

The Antonio Rivera Rodriguez Airport is the only airport in Vieques. There are direct flights from San Juan, Isla Grande and Ceiba. Below are the airlines that operate back and forth to the island:

Appropriate construction site apparel. Skin should be minimally exposed. Closed toed shoes. Sneakers or work boots are highly recommended.

Disclaimer: Apparel and/or shoes worn to job site may be damaged.

Safety

Alcohol and drugs are not allowed on the construction site. The introduction of substances can impair perceptions and create an unsafe environment.

Cigarette breaks are not permitted on job sites. If you must smoke, remove yourself from job site, clean up cigarette butts, and respect clients home.

Inspect all power tools, hand tools, ladders and scaffolding daily. Advise your supervisor immediately of any unsafe conditions or hazards.

Know where the first-aid kit is located and how to get emergency help.
